On behalf of the American Society of Transplantation (AST), representing a majority of medical professionals engaged in the field of solid organ transplantation, we applaud and support your bipartisan leadership to advance H.R. 5273, the Helping Hospitals Improve Patient Care Act of 2016. Among the many provisions included in this important legislation, the AST remains grateful for the inclusion of refinements to the Medicare Hospital Readmissions Reduction Program to prevent hospitals from being unfairly penalized for certain readmissions, including organ transplant patients.

The AST appreciates the support and leadership that the Ways and Means Committee has shown over the years with regard to transplant patients, donors and their families. As you know, transplant patients can require more frequent follow-up care and often unpredictable hospital readmissions to treat and protect their life saving donor organ. We commend the Committee for including provisions in H.R. 5273 to allow the Secretary of Health and Human
