13. Evaluate the current and developing alternatives to orthotopic transplantation.
14. Describe psychosocial risk factors common among transplant recipients and donors.
15. Evaluate emerging evidence on transplantation.
16. Analyze the role of new treatments for heart failure including left ventricular assist devices and transplantation.
17. Identify specific referral and transplantation criteria for major transplant indications.
18. Examine future prospects for respiratory support for patients on circulatory support.
19. Apply current practice and recent advances within dialysis, nephrology and transplantation.
20. Describe immunosuppression management strategies in special populations and disease states.
21. Assess the latest findings on islet transplantation research and its future.
22. Appraise mechanisms involved in intestinal adaptation and therapeutic options available to enhance it.
23. Identify challenges in managing infection in transplant recipients and donors.
24. Analyze current medical care topics surrounding living donor transplantation.
25. Evaluate emerging evidence on heart failure management.
26. Implement management strategies to optimize outcomes for transplant recipients.
